





Winnetka Historical Society elects Philip Hoza president

The Winnetka Historical Society has announced its officers for the coming year, elected at the recent annual meeting.

The new president is Philip J. Hoza, He succeeds Robert K. Long, who served two one-year terms. Other newly elected officers are Lindsay D. Brown, vice president; John M. Butler, treasurer, and Mrs. Virgil Clary, secretary.

The Historical Society was founded in 1932 by a group of Winnetkans headed by Frank Windes, and also including Carrie Burr Prouty, Laura Dickinson, Mary S. King and Samuel Otis.

Hoza, a native of Winnetka, is a descendant of families who have lived in Winnetka since before the turn of the century. The youngest president in the 49-year existence of the society, he has been involved in a variety of community activities, including the refurbishing of the war memorial on the Village Green and the addition of stars for those killed in Korea and Vietnam, the organization and building of "Doc's Corner" at Elm and Chestnut Sts., and the replacement of historical markers.

In accepting his new responsibilities, Hoza has outlined a dynamic program designed to heighten participation and to interest more people in their heritage as Winnetkans.

The society's annual meeting at the Winnetka Woman's Club was entertained by Rosalie Clary, who presented a documentary program with color slides and narration concerning a number of Illinois historical sites.





Farrier's Knife, c. 1936.








