






1896 map of Winnetka structures with 411 Linden Street circled in yellow, WHS Archives




1914 Sanborn Fire Insurance Map with 411 Linden Street circled in yellow, Library of Congress (loc.gov)












1861 Ownership Map of Cook County, Library of Congress



#### Lawrence H. Muesing

Lawrence H. Muesing, 75, former Winnetka resident, died Nov. 14 in Martinsburg,

Mr. Muesing was born in Indianapolis. He studied art and advertising at the John Herron Art Institute, Indiana University, and at The Institute of Design at Illinois Institute of Technology.


He was a veteran of World War II, having served in the U. S. Army Air Corps as a radio operator in a B24 Bomber Unit in the Pacific.

His career was in packaging, and graphic design, and he received 28 awards from the Package Designers Council, Society of Typographic Arts, American Institute of Graphic Arts, The Art Directors Club of Chicago and New York, and The National Hardware Institute.

His work has been published in national and international publications. He presented workshops for the National Packaging Institute Expo at McCormick Place in Chicago and judged the E.I. DuPont National Packaging Student Competition at Illinois Institute of Technology. (Continued on page 28)



Who's Who in Chicago, 1936



### **Additional Common Questions**

- Is my home significant?
  - We only make a determination on a property's historical or architectural significance if requested by the Village of Winnetka Preservation Commission.
- Can I view WHS materials in person?
